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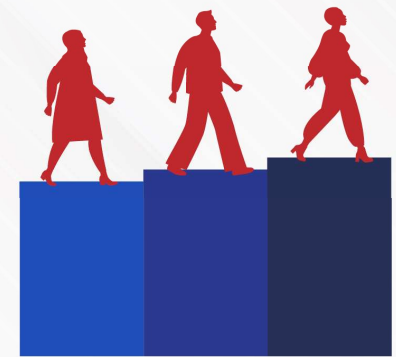

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# Purpose of Today's Session

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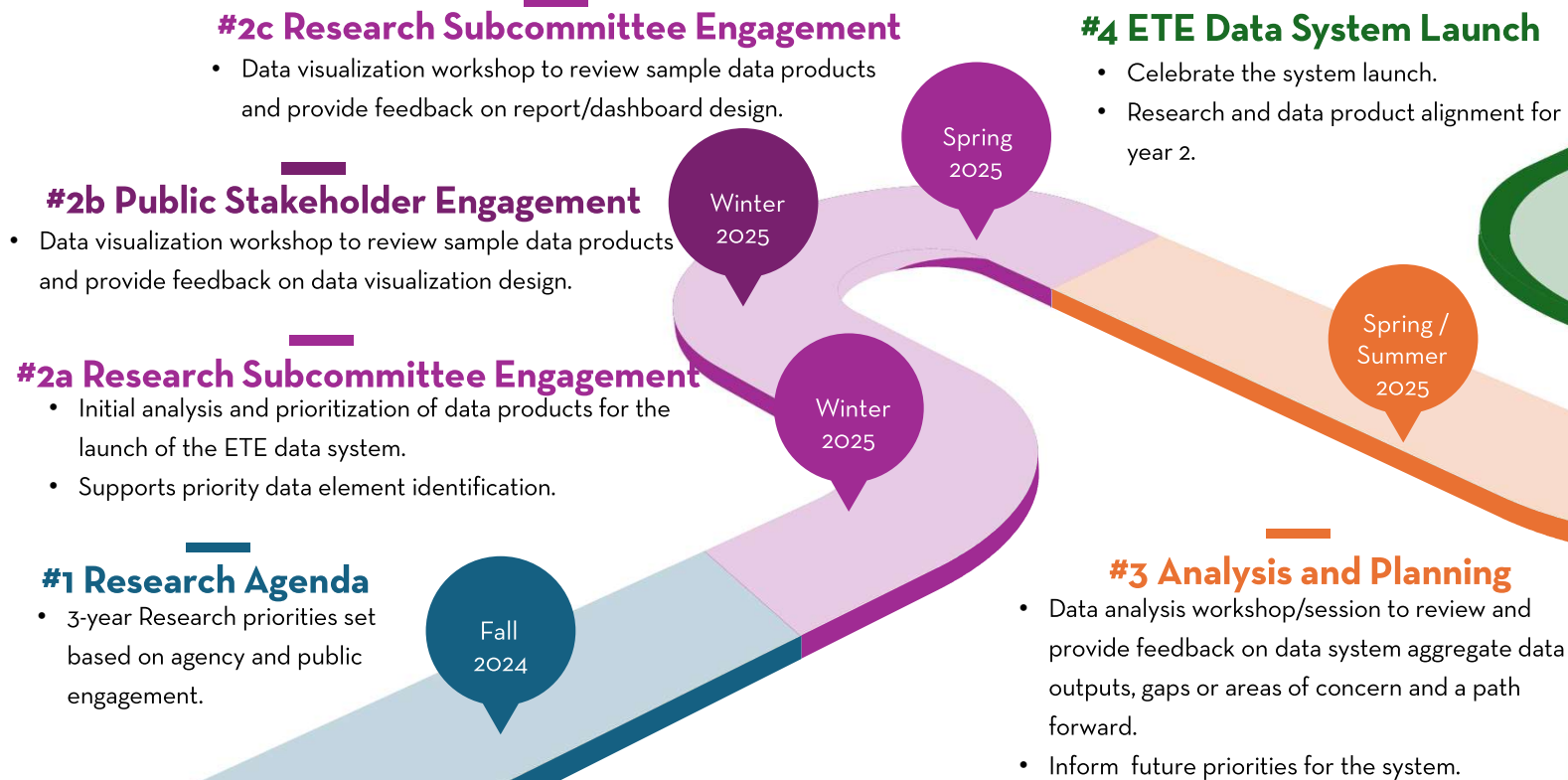

## Data Product Example

Indiana and Resultant designed a revolutionary platform that ingests P20W to define how Indiana students were progressing towards post-secondary readiness.

The platform has led to greater engagement and decision-making with P20W data.

- Outcome data (i.e., postsecondary and workforce) is linked back to the district and school-level
- Utilizes data from the P20W datasets
- Includes the public-facing website and back-end access for school districts to view student-level data

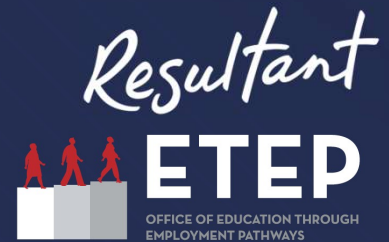
- clearly articulate an intended message or story

  - visually appealing and engaging?
  - relevant to stakeholder needs?

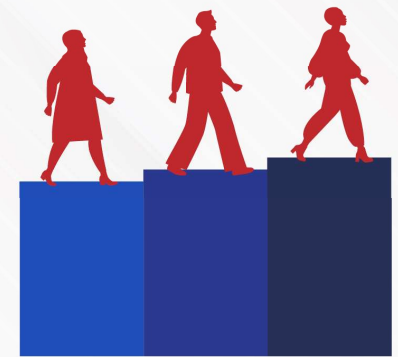
