At-Risk, Objective 1 Develop and support policies and programs to reduce concentrated poverty in public schools.

- Consider using the My School DC lottery to give an advantage to underserved students.
- Explore ways to identify pre-K students who may be underserved.
- Consider a lottery preference for Pre-K and Kindergarten students coming from community-based childcare programs.
- Create "education navigators" who can guide families through the My School DC process.
- Consider creating a diversity plan for the city, with ways to measure progress.
- Consider new policies like magnet schools in underserved neighborhoods.



At-Risk, Objective 2 Invest in efforts to identify, share, and expand programs that serve at-risk students effectively.

- Explore ways for charter schools and traditional schools to work together to create "opportunity academies" for students who are not on track to graduate high school.
- Find ways to identify and expand programs that are working well for students already.
- Promote early literacy and early intervention.
- Provide opportunities for schools to share ideas and learn together.



At-Risk, Objective 3 Bolster and support citywide efforts to improve attendance.

- Increase awareness about the importance of school attendance around the city.
- Bring together educators to share and learn about school attendance.
- Work to understand barriers for students and families to attending school every day.
- Focus on promoting school attendance in the early grades, including Pre-K.
- Host events for the community with trainings about attendance.



At-Risk, Objective 4 Expand and strengthen citywide, cross-sector approaches to sharing data and information.

- Help schools share information about students' needs when they transfer from one school to another.
- Better understand what schools need in terms of student data and information.
- Explore opportunities for citywide approaches to sharing key information about students.



At-Risk, Objective 5 Provide the resources necessary to ensure the success of students who are at risk.

- Explore updating the way schools receive money for students who are underserved to make sure that funds go to the students who are most in need.
- Consider assessing student needs for each school to find out which schools need more resources for students, possibly with a survey.



OCS, Objective 1 Establish a coordinated DC education planning cycle.

- Education leaders review citywide data together to make decisions about school planning that meet the community's needs.
- Regularly engage the public for input at multiple points along the coordinated timeline.
- Develop a formal agreement for DC education leaders to meet and discuss planning together.



OCS, Objective 2

Ensure that planning decisions are informed by common data and information.

- Create a set of data for all education leaders to use to make decisions about opening, closing, and siting schools.
- Engage the public for input on the creation of the dataset.
- Data could include:
 - student demographics
 - o facility locations and capacities
 - academic performance and other quality measures
 - o student demand
 - feeder patterns and enrollment transitions
 - neighborhood factors
 - o enrollment patterns
 - student needs
 - program types
 - transportation access
 - student-teacher ratios, among others



OCS, Objective 3

Align planning timelines and community engagement expectations across sectors.

- Create a public list of important dates and events for school planning decisions.
- Help the both sectors better engage the community in school planning decisions.



Cross-Sector Collaboration Task Force

Purpose:

- Learn together. Objectively consider data to better understand our educational landscape across the city.
- Brainstorm. Brainstorm ideas and generate solutions through cross-sector collaboration and problem-solving.
- Put aside our differences. Consider our current challenges for what they are – citywide challenges - and not side with, or assign blame to, a single sector.
- Generate proposals. Develop clear and fair recommendations on how to reach our goals.



Cross-Sector Collaboration Task Force

Goals:

- Improve the experience of parents and families understanding and navigating their public school options
- Develop methods for information sharing with the public and across public school sectors.
- 3. Develop a framework for coordinating processes on school openings, closings, and facilities planning.
- 4. Promote enrollment stability (recommendations in pilot phase).
- Identify educational challenges that need to be addressed through cross-sector collaboration
