- Develop methods for information sharing with the public and across public school sectors.
- Develop a framework for coordinating processes on school openings, closings, and facilities planning.
- Promote enrollment stability.
- Identify educational challenges that need to be addressed through cross-sector collaboration.

PROPOSED GUIDING PRINCIPLES

In order to actualize the Mayor's vision of high quality public schools in every neighborhood the following principles will guide our work:

- Equitable outcomes for all students with a focus on our lowest performing students
- Authentic public input and participation in policy development
- A core system of public schools of right in every neighborhood complemented by public school choice (DCPS, PCS)
- Equitable access to high quality schools
- Public education policies and planning that reflect the best interests of students and families.
- Effective investment of resources

WORKING DEFINITIONS

Equity in education: Raising the achievement of all students while: narrowing the gaps between the highest- and lowest-performing students; and eliminating the racial predictability and disproportionality of which student groups occupy the highest and lowest achievement categories.

Equitable outcomes: Raising the achievement of all students.

Equitable resources: Those who need the most get the most.

Effective investment: Investment of resources (financial, human capital, programmatic) that successfully produced a desired or intended result.

School of right: Public school to which a student has a right, based on their home address (boundary) or feeder pattern, to attend in grades K-12. Currently, DCPS is the only sector that provides schools of right.
